


BIRDING AT CATTLE POINT

e Washington State Department of Natural cources (DNR) manages 112-acres of rocky oreline, forest, grassland, a freshwater marsh, ditidal lagoon at the Cattle Point Natural cources Conservation Area (NRCA) at the other ath end of San Juan Island. Over 160 species of dis are found here all or part of each year.

s list is a work in progress. Seasonal occurces suggest the best time to see or hear a en species, but this may vary from year to ir. Due to limited space, only one habitat for the species has been listed, although some of se birds utilize many resources at the Cattle nt NRCA. Birds of Cattle Point includes sights from areas adjacent to the NRCA including the Point Estates and Cape San Juan. Sightings verbal communication from credible birders we been included. Taxonomy and nomenclate follow The American Ornithologists' Union eck-List of North American Birds, 7th edition 198) and supplements.




