This project consists of a floating fish trap. It is located on the surface of the Grande Ronde River and is attached to cabling suspended from support towers on each side of the river. The support towers are located just outside of the immediate riparian area.
5m. Describe how the property is currently used. [help]
This project is an inclined plane and rotary screw fish traps. The actual traps float on the surface of the river and are attached to cabling that traverses the river from support towers on each side of the river. The support towers are on Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife Chief Joseph Wildlife Area and the Asotin County right of way for Snake River Road. The Grande Ronde River is used for recreational boating and angling.
5n. Describe how the adjacent properties are currently used. [help]
One side of the river is the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife's Chief Joseph Wildlife area. The other side of the river is Asotin County's right of way for Snake River Road.

There are steel support towers on each bank of the river with cabling for the traps spanning the river between the two towers. The towers are on concrete pads. There is a concrete deadhead buried on the east bank of the river to support the east tower. The west tower is bolted into bedrock. There is also a winch in a metal housing on the east bank of the river.

The site is located at river mile 1.2 on the Grande Ronde River. It is accessed by driving south from Asotin, WA on the Snake River Road for approximately 25 miles.

Identify where each element will occur in relation to the nearest waterbody.
Indicate which activities are within the 100-year floodplain.
This project has been conducted at this site since 1996/1997. There are support towers on each bank of the river with cabling between the two towers. We assemble the inclined plane trap on the river bank and use a crane to place it in the river. The trap is then secured to the existing cabling. The crane remains above the normal high water mark. In low flow years, we sometimes install a rotary screw trap either alone or in conjunction with the inclined plane trap. The rotary screw trap is assembled on the bank and installed by hand. Traps are normally assembled and installed in mid to late February or early March of each year, depending on flow conditions. Traps are removed from the river in early to mid-June of each year. During the remainder of the year, traps are disassembled and removed from the site while the towers and overhead cabling remain in place.

Water flows through the traps, powering the trap mechanism. A small amount of water is used for fish handling and is returned to the river. Impacts to the aquatic environment are minimal, consisting of a slight disruption in laminar flow. Natural debris, such as large and small woody debris and leaves, that accumulates on the trap is returned to the river. Manmade debris that becomes impinged on the trap is removed from the river and disposed of in the local landfill. The traps are operated from mid-February through mid-June of each year. During the off season, the traps are removed from the river and from the site. Overhead cabling and support towers remain onsite year round. The towers are painted in earth tones to minimize visual impact. During trap installation and removal, only hand tools are used within the wetted perimeter of the stream. A crane is used to install and remove the inclined plane trap. The crane
