Do You Have an Old, Unuseful Boat? Please Haul It to a Disposal Site.

When your dreamboat becomes a nightmare or vessel beyond repair, don't abandon it. Please haul it to the nearest proper disposal site (see map on back). That's the right and legal way to get rid of an old boat. You may also get paid for recyclable parts of your boat.

Haul It.



If you own the vessel, take it to a landfill, or rent a dumpster and dismantle the boat yourself after draining and disposing of any hazardous materials. **Find disposal sites on back.**

Or Report It.



If you see an abandoned or derelict vessel, please report it by calling **360-902-2628**, or use the online Derelict & Abandoned Reporting Tool (DART) in our website.

Can't Haul It? Apply for the Vessel Turn-In Program (VTIP).



If you are unable to dispose of your boat and do not have the financial means to do so, you may qualify for the Vessel Turn-In Program, which helps approved owners dispose of their vessels safely and legally, and may even cover the cost.

Derelict vessels may contain large quantities of oil or other toxic substances. If leaked they can injure or kill marine mammals, waterfowl and other aquatic life; and contaminate aquatic lands, nearby shorelines, and water quality.

Drifting, beached, broken-up or sunken vessels can threaten human safety and navigation, and have an impact on aquatic habitats.
