## Welcome, Introductions, & Old Business

# **Staff Updates:**

- Lori Clark introduced Theryn Henkel as the Supervisory Project Manager.
- Jenelle Black explained that the CMER Natural Resource Technician was hired. Robert will start next week.

#### **Public Comments:**

No written public comments were received.

## **TFW Policy Updates:**

Court Stanley gave an update on what was discussed at the June Timber Fish and Wildlife (TFW) Policy Committee meeting.

#### **CMER Co-chair Vote:**

Jenny Knoth explained that Aimee McIntyre was nominated and has accepted the 2-year term nomination and Joe Murray and A.J. Kroll were nominated for a 1-year term. Joe Murray declined the nomination and A.J. Kroll has accepted another 1-year term to reinstate the stagger rotation for the position. All nominees confirmed with their employer there is support for serving this position. There was a vote. Aimee McIntyre was elected as the co-chair serving a 2-year term and A.J. Kroll was elected as the co-chair serving a 1-year term.

# **Roads Project Updates:**

Alexander Prescott announced that the published manuscript is available and the link for the document is in the CMER SAG Updates with the meeting materials.

#### **CMER Science Technician:**

Lori Clark explained that NWIFC hired someone to be the CMER Science Technician for the program to help with the efficiency of the program. Jenelle explained that they chose to hire someone instead of contracting it out every time. They will help with multiple projects starting with FWEP, PHB/DPC, and possibly Roads. The commission hired someone, Robert, and they will start next week. Funding for this position is coming from project funds and not administrative funding.

#### **CMER Statistician SOW Input:**

The Adaptive Management Program has dedicated funding for the CMER Statisticain on the Master Project Schedule (MPS) for the FY24-FY25 budget for \$20,000 (\$10,000 per fiscal year). The AMP staff are beginning the solicitation development process and seek CMER input into the consultant requirements. We hope to begin the solicitation in July. CMER input was received.

# **Open Public Meeting Act (OPMA) Video:**

Lori Clark explained that the video shared was created by the Attorney General's office and is a requirement for CMER members to watch. The video was shared on the screen and Lori answered questions after the video.

#### **Eastside Timber Habitat Evaluation Project (ETHEP) Study Design:**

Anna Toledo gave a brief update on the project study design. Explained that the request today is to approve the ETHEP study design and then the next step will be sending the study design to ISPR.

## **Eastside Timber Habitat Evaluation Project (ETHEP) - ISPR Recommendation:**

Anna Toledo explained that now that the study design has been approved the request is to send the study design to ISPR. It was discussed and decided to remove "certified" from certified silviculturist and add statistical design on the CMER SAG request.

#### Protocols and Standards Manual (PSM) Sections 1-3:

Lori Clark shared the track changes version and reviewed the comments/edits while doing live edits as needed. It was decided that CMER members can review and add comments/edits to the document on SharePoint until July 11th and will be on the July CMER agenda as a decision item.

# Riparian Characteristics and Share Response (RCS) Prospective 6 Questions:

Anna Toledo explained that the request today is to approve the RCS Prospective 6 Questions. Chris Mendoza explained that not all his comments were addressed and is not comfortable approving the RCS Prospective 6 Questions today. There was discussion on other concerns about the document and what the next steps should be. It was decided that it will go back to the project team to address the unresolved comments in a hybrid setting. Anna Toledo and Natalie Church will schedule this meeting.

## Potential Habitat Breaks (PHB) Charter:

Anna Toledo explained the request and brief update on the charter. Hans Berge explained that Cody Thomas would like to have his name taken off and add Emma Greenwood to the project team. There was a discussion on what the next step should be, and it was decided that this need to be discussed at ISAG and will be brought back to CMER next month.
