Policy Meeting Report: Cramer

ISPR Update: Cramer

UPSAG study design for the prescription-scale mass wasting effectiveness monitoring (post-mortem) study was delivered to the UW. Should be done in about 8 weeks.

SAG Requests

Recommendation that CMER forward a request to the FFR Policy Committee to fill the CMER Coordinator position: Sturhan

Sturhan has taken on all the duties of the CMER coordinator in the absence of a coordinator. She provided an estimate of time required and the list of duties from the P&S Manual. CMER agreed to forward the request to the FFR Policy Committee.

RSAG Request to move forward with collection of BTO-Add on Study data with change to a 50% sampling of standing tree data: Schuett-Hames and Mendoza

The request was approved after extensive discussion of the variability analysis report, which was handed out at the CMER meeting. The variability report and the SAG request need to be appended to the study plan to document and support the change in the sampling procedures. Dick Miller suggested collecting additional shade data at intervals moving out from the stream to better document the effect of treatments on shade conditions and scheduled water temperature and light attenuation measurements. This issue was remanded to RSAG and BTSAG for further evaluation.

UPSAG Request for an additional \$200K in Tier 1 of the FY08 budget to complete the initial sampling event: Dieu and Vaugeois

CMER approved sending a recommendation to policy committee to approve the preferred alternative (reduced block size- 60 blocks of 4 sq. mi). Sally Butts expressed concern about changing study designs that had been through the peer review process in order to save money. Others suggested that CMER should be conducting analyses such as this to improve sampling efficiency. This concern would be addressed <u>in future studies</u> by incorporating a pilot phase in the original study design to address variability <u>and costs</u>, <u>then</u> revise the sampling plan accordingly.

Status Tracker: BTSAG, SAGE and WETSAG sent in. Still need LWAG, RSAG, and UPSAG or a note saying no changes.

Intensive Monitoring Project Update: Sturhan

8 people attended the intensive monitoring meeting last week. Bill E and Curt V will develop a set of critical questions for sediment and present to UPSAG. Doug will incorporate revisions in the draft document and present to CMER in May.

DOE temperature modeling for hardwood conversion. Sturhan and Ehinger.

Nancy has received revised document from DOE. The document is heavily revised. The initial CMER reviewers need to look at the revised document (Hunter, Butts, Jackson, McConnell, and Miller). The document will be sent out to the <u>previous</u> reviewers who will <u>submit comments back to Bill E. by May 15th. Bill will report on the status of finalizing the document at the May and/or June CMER meeting.</u>

Remote sensing methods (Grotefendt) Report: Mendoza.

Final report received, will be reviewed by RSAG and brought to next CMER meeting <u>for final approval.</u>

RMZ Resample Report: Sturhan.

Nancy has received report. CMER reviewers will be requested at the May CMER meeting. Nancy wanted to give folks some lead time because of the length of the document (360 pages), and this review will require wildlife expertise. Sally Butts volunteered to be a reviewer, Terry Jackson will try to find a reviewer at WDF. Nancy will call the NWIFC and ask if there is a tribal wildlife bio who would be able to review the document.

WETSAG meeting with Policy wetlands subgroup: Sturhan.

A small group of policy and WETSAG members met to get policy guidance on wetland research and monitoring. Various wetland project ideas were discussed. The Policy subgroup recommended that WETSAG focus their efforts on a study of wetland mitigation effectiveness. The Policy sub-group will report to Policy at the May meeting. We can assume that Policy will support the sub-group's recommendation.

CMER Co-chair Nominations: Sturhan

Mark Hunter nominated Mark Mobbs, Quinault Tribe. Mark said he will talk to his supervisor. Chris Mendoza nominated both Curt Velhuisen, Skagit River System Coop

and Sally Butts, USFWS. Jim McCracken nominated Doug Martin, Martin Environmental. Doug Martin stated that he has support from his employer (WFPA) to continue to fill the co-chair position. These four names will be forwarded to the Policy Committee.
