

CERTIFIED PRESCRIBED BURN MANAGER VIOLATIONS

POINT ASSESSMENT TABLE

1.	Certified Burner conducts a burn without obtaining a burn permit when required.	Fifteen (15) points
2.	Certified Burner obtains a permit/smoke authorization knowingly using false information (For example, Lat./Long. Section, Township and Range from the public land survey, Certified burn number, equipment on site, personnel). Deception is attempted.	Fifteen (15) Points
3.	Failure to attempt to shut down a burn after notification from DNR or other authorized agency.	Five (5) points
4.	Any burn initiated outside of prescription parameters based upon morning forecast (For example, wind speed, relative humidity, dispersion, temperature, etc.).	Five (5) Points
5.	Certified Burner who attempts to burn as a Certified Burner without a written prescription at the site of burn, while burn is being conducted.	Five (5) points
6.	Failure to pay suppression charges for an escaped burn within 15 days of receipt of second notice from DNR.	Three (3) points
7.	Improper smoke screening (Does not identify or mitigate for smoke sensitive areas).	Two (2) points
8.	The DNR or other emergency response agency is required to take suppression.	Two (2) points
9.	Deviation from official burn permit and/or smoke management guidelines.	Two (2) points

This is the de-certification point system. An accumulation of 15 points over the course of any 3-year period will cause you to lose your certification. A Decertified CPBM must complete the Certification process again.
