On DNR Trails

- Foot travel only. No motorized use, mountain bikes or horseback riding.
- Stay on signed, DNR-managed trails to avoid damaging sensitive environments associated with meadows, wetlands and alpine heather.
- Protect natural features by not touching or removing plants, animals or historic artifacts.
- Pets must be leashed.
- Observe wildlife without interrupting their activities.
- Respect the rights of others on trails.
- Practice leave no trace ethics (pack it out and use designated toilets).
- Watch for hazardous trail conditions.

In DNR Campsites and At DNR Trailheads

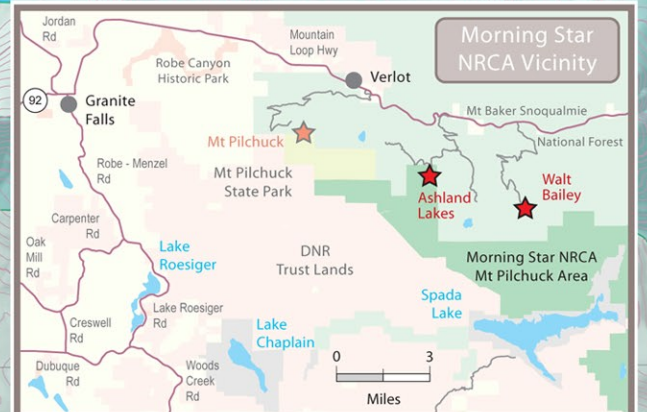
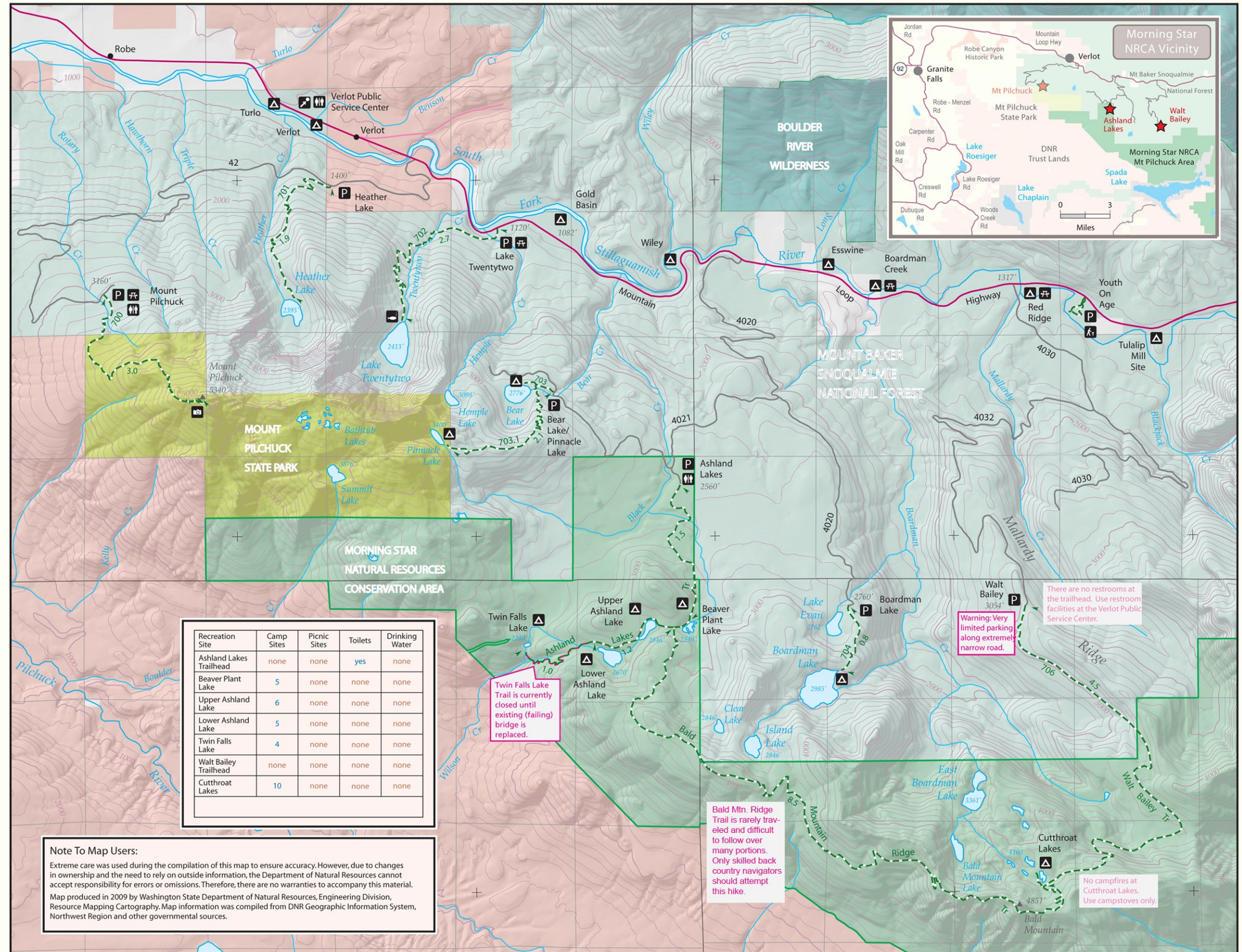
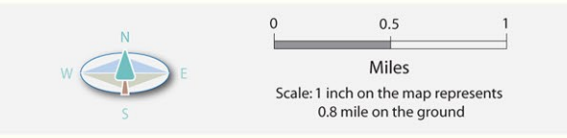
- Camp in designated campsites only. No camping in day use areas.
- No overnight camping Oct 15 to June 15. Day use only.
- Use designated toilet sites.
- No toilets at sites. Use backcountry practices for disposing of human and pet waste.
- Limit campfires to designated steel campsite fireplaces. Use only dry, dead and down material. Leave large decomposing wood as habitat.
- Maintain quiet between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.
- Limit your stay to the posted number of days.
- Do not alter or remove vegetation.
- No garbage service is provided. Pack out garbage and litter. Leave no trace of your visit.
- Secure food supplies. Protect wildlife from human food sources.
